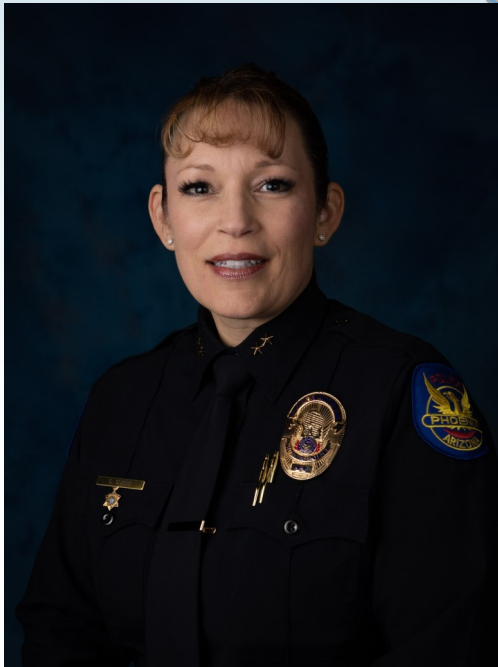

She has worked in various capacities around the department to include: Family Investigations, Professional Standards, operational support in both patrol and jail settings, the Chief's Office and in the Community Engagement Bureau. This is the third time Charmane has been assigned to the Desert Horizon Precinct, she was here as a sergeant, a lieutenant and now as the commander.

Charmane volunteers with multiple organizations including; the Phoenix Police Museum, the Phoenix Police Honor Guard, treasurer for the Arizona Chapter of the FBI

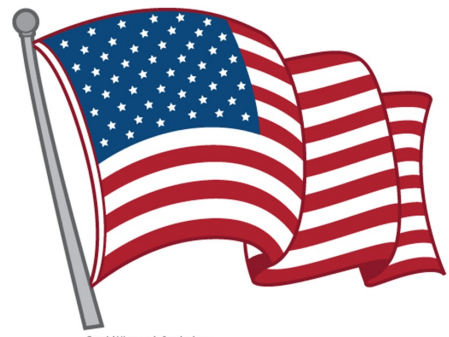

Happy Birthday!



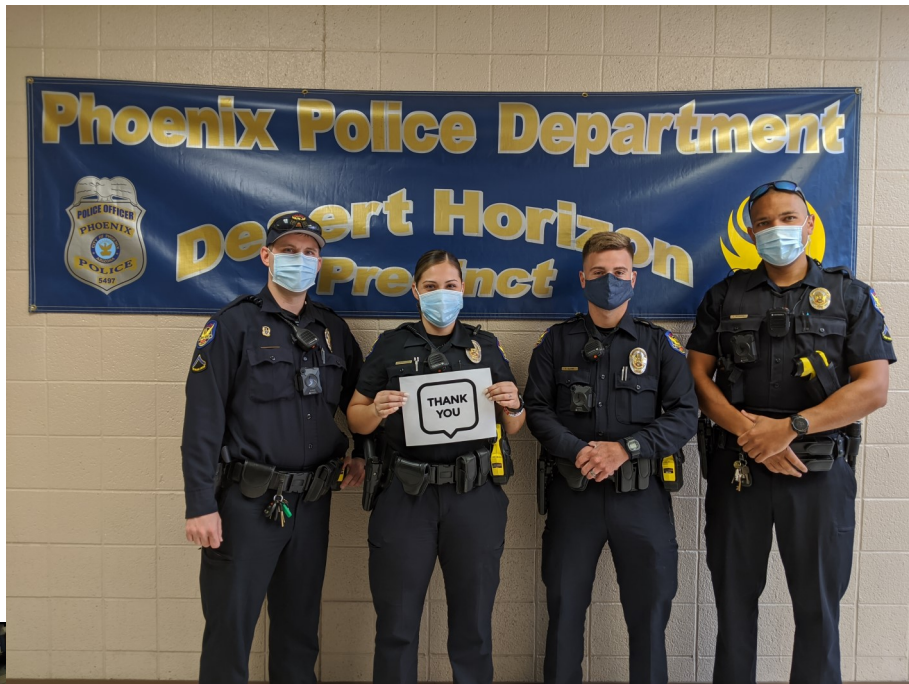
