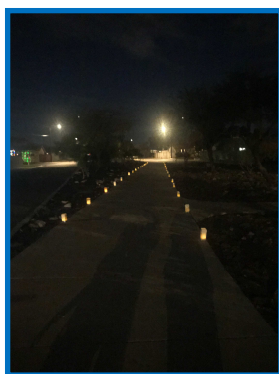

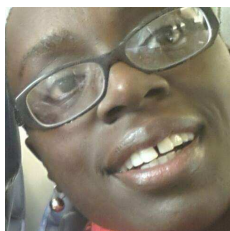

A New Mural at the Sunnyslope Historical Society



Some of you old timers may remember that the Sunnyslope Historical building was originally a drug store. The People's Drug Store's original structure was built in the 1940's and was located at 111 E. Dunlap Avenue. A local Pharmacist, Bob Rice, established the pharmacy and put in what would be the first drive-thru window in Arizona, only

the 5th in all of the nation. The building was later moved in 1999 to its current location, 737 E. Hatcher Road, which is now the Sunnyslope Historical Society Museum.

On December 15th, the Historical Society unveiled a new mural painted on that very same drive-thru window wall. The mural was created by a local valley artist named Tim Medina of Medina Art Design. Medina created a 1929 Studebaker pulling up to the old pharmacy window! Medina, who has lived in the Valley since 1994, has done many murals in the Valley as well as portraits, pinups, and even religious art. You can review his portfolio and learn more about his team at www.medinaartdesign.com. Medina began the project in September and completed it in early November.

The museum's idea of the Studebaker came from Tommy Abbott of the local Abbott family. The Abbott family came to Sunnyslope from Michigan in the 1920s due to lung disease and set up a make-shift home at the base of "S" Mountain. The family built a home with a family room and kitchen and slept the nights in two tents, separated by boy/girl. During the unveiling Tommy Abbott, the youngest son, told the story about how "people knew it was the Abbott family driving through town by the number of feet hanging out the window." Abbott went on to quip, "Back then there was no air conditioning and so we needed to do something to stay cool!"

The mural was a joint effort of your East Sunnyslope Neighborhood Association & Block Watch, the Sunnyslope Historical Society Museum, and the City of Phoenix Arts & Culture Department.

Congratulations to all involved! The new mural not only beautifies the building, but reminds us of our Sunnyslope History!



What the Historical Fact?!



In honor of our continued relationship with the Sunnyslope Historical Society Museum, we have decided to start a new quarterly fun-fact section. Each quarter we will discuss a fun or interesting fact from Sunnyslope's History.

Did you know that Sunnyslope originally housed the sick?! That's right, Sunnyslope is known for having been originally settled by people suffering from lung diseases; such as, asthma and tuberculosis. It was believed that the drier climate and cleaner air would benefit those suffering from these issues. With no irrigation north of the canal, the desert in Sunnyslope was a very dry area. People who moved from the East to this area were known as "health seekers" or "lungers". They built temporary tents and small cottages, planning to eventually return home.

There were no roads, sewage, or electricity at this time. According to an AZ climate study by ASU, temperatures were reported in the 110's even then. Above are some photos of the types of desert tents used. Take a look and be glad for your A/C unit!!!

Hard to believe, I know, but I haven't always lived here in Sunnyslope. My Dad was in construction and you went where the work was. Which lead us from Florida to Las Vegas, NV to the south suburbs of Chicago. As soon as I figured out what all that white stuff was and how cold it could be, my #1 goal was to get back to warm weather and a desert.

I met Rob while in my Senior year of high school, graduated, had a couple jobs, one of which was delivering mail the winter of 1975-1976 back in IL. If I made it to the 90th day, I was in the Postal Workers Union. On the 89th day, I was informed I was being laid off. I was sooo happy! Spent the rest of the meeting consoling the supervisor laying me off.

Came home, told Rob we were moving out west. "Where?" he asked. "Don't care, but it has to be desert, blue sky and mountains." "How about Phoenix?" "Done!" That was our whole conversation. We moved here in August of 1976 in a 1969 Dodge Dart, with no AC and black vinyl seats. It was love at first sight!

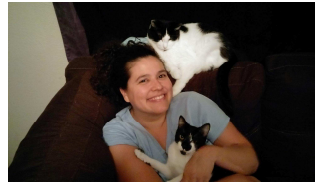
The apartments we lived in for the first 2 years are just off I-17 and Butler, and are still there. When we arrived, Metro Center was still new. Across I-17 from Metro Center was all cotton fields, and the whole town shut down at 6PM. It was like living in a small town...and I finally got warm.

We bought our home here in Sunnyslope in 1978 and got married in the back yard a year later. (Took Rob some 6 years to convince me getting married was a good idea.) A few years later we had two kids, who now live just north of here with their children. Currently three grandkids, all boys.

Since I worked nights for so many years, Rob was the one that did Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts with our children. Through Boy Scouts we met Paul and Betty Bellanger who were very active in the preservation of New North Town, running the Block Watch and had a special interest in the children at Desert View Elementary School. Seeing what a difference a small group of people could do for an area, I was hooked.

I take great pride in living here, love meeting all the wonderful neighbors I have, and working with a group of people with huge open hearts. You guys are what makes Sunnyslope the place to be! Thank You!

I am an actual Arizona native, or Desert Flower as my Dad calls me. I even had the fortune of being born right here in Sunnyslope at John C. Lincoln Hospital. My mother was working at Good Sam's at

Milkweed Project is Underway!

made donations toward the purchase of additional pollinating plants.



As we get closer to the March 9th planting date, Desert Botanical Garden will help us choose complementary plants to the Milkweeds, all based on what will be available from their green house. This generous donation may double our initial planting! (Thank you!!)

Announcements at our meetings, on the web site and Facebook page will have all the information regarding the planting day. Then we can kick back on our new benches and watch for butterflies!

"Wait. What new benches?!" Our Desert Horizon Police Department donated two benches (part of our GAIN registration package) that will be placed along the Walkway for your leisurely pleasure in January. The Block Watch is hoping for approval in our 2019 Grant Request to add a few more too. The 10th Street Walkway is going to be quite the center of Sunnyslope for people, plants and bugs.

Adopting 12th Street from Dunlap to Northern which requires quarterly cleanups. Another successful GAIN event at Palma Park. Joining forces with Sunnyslope Manor (a senior living facility) assisting them in getting a grant of \$10,000.00 to revamp a dilapidated community garden. Partnering with the Sunnyslope Historical Society to obtain a grant for a mural on their building. Finally, to finish out 2018, the first and very successful Christmas on 10th Street that was the brainchild of Leticia Garcia, Captain of East El Camino. We finished 2018 with over 360 members, logged over 1200 volunteer hours, and helped to get \$45,000.00 invested in our neighborhood. - ◆ Complete mandatory PNP training

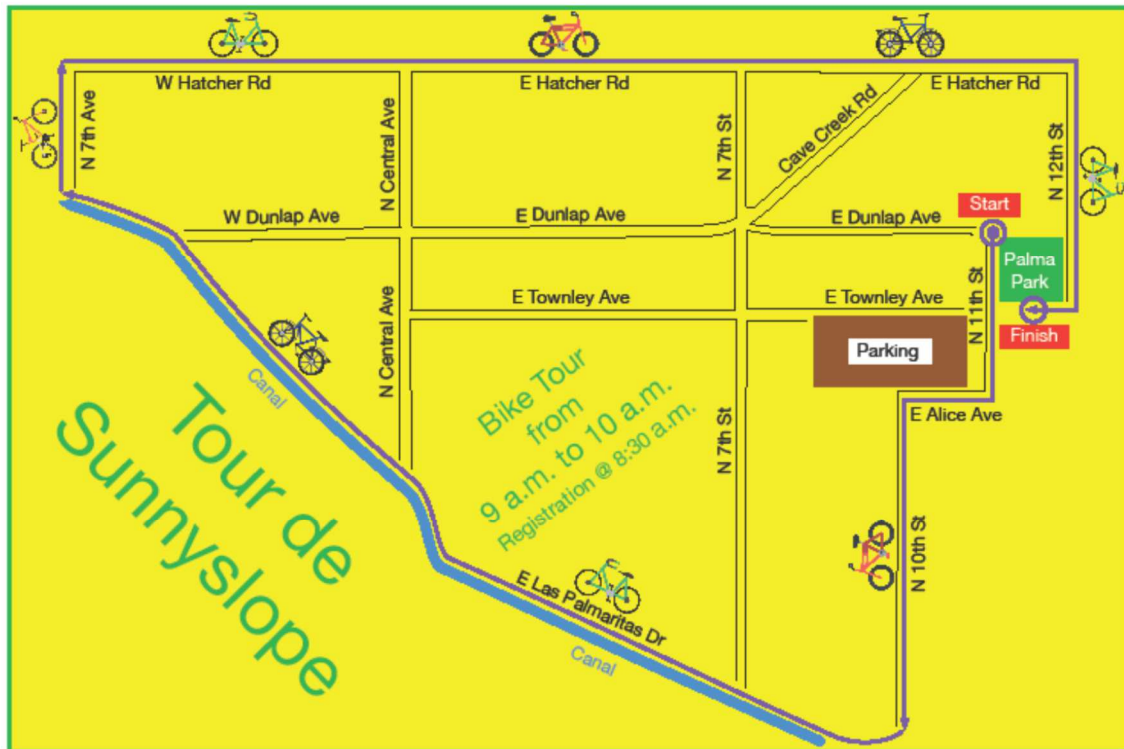
